

The town of Bedourie derives its name from First Nation Peoples' word for dust storm - Bidouri.

Mayor Francis Murray

I took advantage of the opportunity at the LGAQ Mayor's Forum at Parliament House, Brisbane to meet with Bart Mellish, Minister for Transport and Main Roads, and emphasise how important it is to seal the roads into Birdsville, but mainly to finish the Birdsville Bedourie road at the Cuttaburra Crossing. I followed this theme up at the Civic Leaders Summit at a forum on liveability. While others were discussing cost of living, I thought it important to point out that we ask only for comparable liveability, my argument being that until we have a sealed road to Birdsville, we are significantly disadvantaged.

I was invited to attend the Wangkangurru-Yarluyandi directors' meeting on country in Birdsville. The W-Y are keen to build upon their working relationship with the Diamantina Shire Council, and I am equally keen to see the council working closely with our Traditional Owners. Council was well represented at a meeting with the Pitta Pitta Aboriginal Corporation in Boulia where a respectful relationship was also developed.

All the councillors and CEO spent the day inspecting council and community infrastructure in Birdsville which is clearly in need of either upgrading, replacement or maintenance schedules, however, it was great to see our streetscape in excellent condition, which is a credit to Alarna Achterberg's Parks and Gardens team.



It was a great surprise to see Barry and Narelle Gaffney back in town to prepare Barry's Volvo Prime Mover to go to the Winton Truck Museum. Barry and Narelle spent their entire lives in our region and are known by many.

Hopefully the roads will stay dry now so our tourist and events season can get into full swing.

As the year rolls on, Diamantina Shire Council has been busy undertaking elected member inductions and ensuring council, councillors and the communities are set up for success over the next four years. Sessions and workshops have been undertaken with the Queensland Department of State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning, the Local Government Association of Queensland and the Queensland Treasury Corporation.

Council is also focused on the implementation of several reforms, along with its Financial Turnaround Strategy, which is concentrated on financial governance, the 2023/24 budget review, plant accounting, development of the 24/25 budget and preparation for finalisation of the accounting statements for the current financial year.

Council has also agreed to establish a Plant and Machinery Committee and an Audit Committee which will provide a governance framework to ensure sufficient time is dedicated to these important matters.

Congratulations to our Mayor who is now the new Chair of the Outback Regional Road and Transport Group!




Birdsville Races September 6 - 7

Event season is upon us and I thank our Council teams for the preparatory work they have undertaken to support our club and committee volunteers. We're excited about the tourism season and expect large attendances generally and to these community events.



Council has experienced some significant staff turnover of late, which is cause to say thank-you to all who have contributed to the Diamantina way of life and to improving community liveability. We look forward to our new wave of employees commencing and to the strong contributions they will make to build our momentum. Jason Beaton will join us as Chief Operating Officer from June 10 and Acting Director of Corporate Services Lorelle Hatch will join us from June 13. All vacancies will be advertised internally and externally as we engage replacement employees.

Regarding the employment of the Diamantina Shire Council CEO position, we can report that from 54 applications, 5 were shortlisted, 4 interview and we are now down to the final two, who will travel out for the final stages of the interview process with the full council.



Can I please encourage residents and landholders to attend the public information sessions for the review of the Georgina Diamantina Water Plan. This is an important opportunity to seek information and provide input. A session will be held at Bedourie on 25 June and at Birdsville on 26 June.

At the time of writing this article, Diamantina Shire Council has attended the Civic Leaders Summit which was held at the Gold Coast from 21-22 May and it is presently participating in Remote Area Planning and Development Board Meetings at Blackall from 27-29 May, 2024. These are important opportunities for regional advocacy and for championing outback issues.

In closing, we will hold our next Council Meeting at Bedourie on 17 June.




Community and Tourism




The Bash is an opportunity for participants to explore remote and regional areas while raising funds for kids in need and making a genuine difference in the lives of Australian families.

Seed Bombs

Plant wildflowers with seed bombs!

Seed bombs are great fun for children and adults! Start by getting outside and collecting some wildflower seeds from areas that are not protected. Dry the seeds for a day or two.





Seed Bomb Recipe

You will need:

- 4 parts clay
- 1 part fine compost
- seeds
- water to moisten

Mix the clay, fine compost and seeds together with enough water for the mixture to stick together, but not so wet it becomes a gluggy mess – and you also don't want the seeds to germinate straight away. You want that to happen later. Get it to a play doh-like consistency.

Shape the mixture into balls the size of golf balls, being quite gentle when forming them – not compressing them too hard and that's important so when they do remoisten, they'll break apart and the seeds can germinate.

Once formed, pop them on a tray to dry in a cool, airy space. Dried seed bombs can be stored in a paper bag until the next big rain when they can be scattered.

Get creative about flinging or slinging (disseminating) those seeds out into the environment. Sling-making instructions are available on kids.NationalGeographic.com

Sedges have edges!

'Sedges have edges, rushes are round and grasses have knees that bend all the way to the ground'.

Sedges, rushes and grasses are among the most diverse plant groups in the Great Artesian Basin springs and can be difficult to tell apart. Sedges usually have triangular stems (edges) with leaves arranged in groups of three. Rushes usually have cylindrical, hollow stems, and grasses generally have leaves growing from the base and/or nodes. In the right combination they do wonders for the environment.

Here's how:

Wildlife habitat - provides a home for various creatures

Natural buffer – prevent soil erosion and help filter excess nutrients

Stabilise soil - the root systems enhance permeability and soil structure, reducing the risk of collapse. This helps maintain the integrity of the aquifer recharge area by preventing sedimentation. The recharge is like a 'fresh drink' for our underground water reserves.

The Queensland Government is reviewing and replacing the Georgina and Diamantina water plan. With your feedback, we can make sure the new water plan best meets the needs of all water users in the area, while maintaining water flows needed to support cultural values and the natural environment.


