Until next month, when we hopefully get back to normality with the reopening of our road network.










Autumn has certainly brought some much-needed rains and, more recently, cooler weather to our region. Our thoughts are with those most affected by recent flooding across the west, as they endure the hardship of rebuilding.

The flooded creeks and rivers that have kept us stranded for weeks are now receding. This last week, we saw the opening of roads across the Shire that had been closed for many weeks. If you are travelling, be extra careful and observe any road signage, as roads may be damaged.

Although many of us expect to be stranded in the outback as we stock up on essentials prior to the wet season, it has been a trying time for some. A few stranded tourists have been able to make their way to their next adventure since the roads have opened. The resupply options provided during these times are welcomed.

I was amazed to see our staff spring into action during the past weeks of flooding, to do what they all do so well! It is true what they say, "Many hands make light work!" A big thank you to everyone for your efforts and understanding throughout the flooding. Tourists are beginning to make their way into Bedourie, so we must now get back into normality.

A lot of mozzies seem to be around as the flooding recedes, so please take care to avoid bites.

The first of three hands-on sessions on the 'Leading and Managing Teams' training program was delivered over two days to supervisors and managers. This training has been very well received.

#### Roads

- High-intensity management with the Local Disaster Management Group is now virtually complete for this 2025 flood event.
- We are still experiencing moderate flooding in the Diamantina River at Birdsville. Levels are slowly receding.
- Emergent work continues to make roads trafficable, with crews working on the sections:
  - o Betoota towards Birdsville
  - o Springvale to Boulia Shire Boundary Road
  - o King Creek to Monkira Road area
  - o Adria Downs access road
  - o Sandringham to Ethabuka Road, and Sandringham to Bedourie and Kamaran access road
- Bedourie to Boulia opened on April 25, 2025.
- Bedourie to King Creek opened on May 1.
- The Bedourie to Windorah road opened on Monday, May 5, 2025.

There is some road damage, so please observe any signage and "Drive to prevailing conditions".

Remember - "If it's flooded, forget it".





## **Community Services and Facilities**

- A master planning strategy for sports and recreation facilities across the Shire has been initiated. This planning will be Council-led, with community consultation in due course.
- An investigation into the suitability and pricing of family day care facilities in Bedourie and Birdsville has been initiated with the intent of enabling an external party to manage them.
- Our new look Bedourie Library has opened in the Community Centre.

Our Director of Communities has recently been promoting the Diamantina Shire and the Desert Champions Way: Outback Camel Trail at the NSW Caravan and Camping show in Sydney. Promotions for our 2025 event season are expanding across Queensland.

IVG Global Pty Ltd was the successful tenderer for managing the Birdsville and Bedourie Tourist Parks, and we look forward to building this partnership.

Council is looking to introduce a Certified Agreement, so we have developed a Log of Claims (or wish list) that we will shortly be able to share with our staff when we commence the consultation process.

Following the flooding event, we are updating the Local Resilience Action Plans, which will guide the Council in seeking funding for projects to boost our resilience, such as flood modelling, flood cameras, river gauges and air conditioning for the Shire's community halls.

The National Heavy Vehicle Regulator is working with Council to develop documents that will facilitate the introduction of a 10/4 rostering arrangement for our construction crews.



At our staff training sessions in February, our staff expressed interest in designing their own 'Fun Friday' shirts. We have sent several designs of Diamantina Shire Council "Fun Friday" shirts to the designer. Stay tuned for these exciting designs.

Last month, we welcomed Juanita as our Executive Assistant and Kiri as Tourism Officer at our Wirrarri Visitor Information Centre in Birdsville. We also farewelled Alana, the Town Supervisor in Birdsville and Richard, our Funding and Economic Development Manager. We are sorry to see them go and wish them the very best in their future endeavours.

Part of the global dark-sky movement to reduce light pollution, the project aims to protect the region's pristine night skies and attract year-round, eco-conscious tourism. From stargazing experiences to science education, the benefits could be as vast as the Milky Way above.

Council has been installing light monitors across the Shire to gather essential data — the first step toward formal recognition.

"There's magic in an outback night sky," says Director of Communities, Patrice Brandenburg. "This project is about sharing that wonder and building our tourism industry."




# Free influenza (flu) vaccinations are now available to all Oueenslanders 6 months and older.

Make a plan to get vaccinated in April or May to ensure you're protected through the winter months when flu season is at its peak.

The free flu vaccine is available until 30 September 2025 from your GP, PHCs, pharmacies and other vaccination service providers.

The best way to protect yourself and your loved ones from the flu is to get vaccinated. This makes it less likely you'll suffer serious illness and need to be hospitalised.





## Trick question! You're not a bug that spreads mosquito-borne viruses.

Mozzies aren't just annoying, they're famous for spreading serious diseases.

In Queensland, we can get quite a few of them— Dengue, Ross River and Japanese encephalitis, just to name a few.

The best way to stay out of their spotlight? Avoid getting bitten by:

- covering up in loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing.
- applying insect repellent that contains DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus.
- covering doors and windows with insect screens.
- cleaning up around the home, especially in areas with stagnant water.

Most mozzie bites will result in no issues or symptoms. If you start experiencing diarrhoea, headaches, fever, or nausea, contact your local health provider.

## Kevin Barr | Works Manager

All crews have had a well-deserved break over the Easter period and ANZAC weekend. We thank the community for their continued patience during this time as we deal with the impacts of widespread rainfall and flooding across the Shire.

A number of roads remain closed due to water damage, but we are beginning to see gradual improvements. As roads reopen, we ask motorists to drive carefully—many sections have sustained significant damage, and road edges may still be soft and unstable.

We also remind drivers to exercise extra caution around Cattle Road Trains. These heavy vehicles will be moving through the region in increasing numbers, particularly as properties begin moving stock. Please give them plenty of space, and where possible, allow them full use of the roadway.

Please note, major flooding is still present in the Diamantina River at Birdsville, although water levels are slowly receding.

Thank you to all our staff and contractors for their efforts under challenging conditions, and to our residents and road users for their continued cooperation and understanding as we work to restore safe access across the Shire.







## Zack Kinivan's Maintenance Crew

Zack's crew was working on the Mooraberree-Betoota Road when the latest rain event began. The area has experienced considerable rainfall and flooding over the past month. Currently, one grader has been operating from Betoota towards Birdsville to repair washouts and scours and make the road trafficable. A full crew will return to the Birdsville-Betoota section once roads become accessible.

## Jade Smith's Maintenance Crew

Prior to the wet weather, Jade's crew was working on the Springvale to Boulia Shire Boundary road. This area has recorded over 300 mm of rain, with severe flooding causing extensive damage—including to previously repaired sections of road. The crew returned last week to carry out Emergent Work to reopen access. They will continue with Flood Damage Restoration works across the Springvale area in the coming weeks.

## Francis Warren's Civil Crew

The Civil Crew has been based at the Bedourie Depot, undertaking cleanup activities across sheds and yard areas. They have erected hazard signage on all accessible damaged road sections around Bedourie. They've also supported the Parks and Gardens Crew during this time. Once more roads reopen, the Civil Crew will continue with signage replacement and bitumen repairs as required.





## Patrol Grader Crew

This team has recently completed repair work on washouts along Kamaran Downs Access Road and the Bedourie to Sandringham Road. They have been unable to access the Sandringham to Ethabuka section due to flooding in the Mulligan River. Currently, they are working on the King Creek to Monkira Road, which has sustained major damage in sections.

Upcoming works include a Light Formation Grade on the Lake Machattie Detour Road followed by repairs to the Adria Downs Access Road. The Patrol Grader Crew consists of two graders, one multi roller, and two water trucks.

### Other Works and Contractors

To assist with the scale of the damage, we have engaged contractors to support key works:

- A contractor crew is undertaking Emergent Work on the Adria Downs Access Road, where significant damage has occurred and urgent access is required for stock movement.
- A contractor dozer is conducting gravel works in pits along the Bedourie-Birdsville Road, and will soon be relocated to the Vaughn Johnson Lookout Access Road for drainage repairs.
- Additional contractor trucks and water carts are also working in tandem with Council crews, including towing Council tippers to maximise efficiency.






## Meet Jo-Ann – Loving Every Minute in the Channel Country


