### MAYOR'S REPORT

### **CR GEOFF MORTON**



Hello all, we are well and truly into the busy season with tourists and cattle trucks everywhere. Also socially busy with Bedourie Campdraft /Rodeo, Camel races and Birdsville Bronco Branding. Unfortunately due to work and council commitments I was unable to see much of any of these.

First up for the month, was a visit to the shire by Brendan Worrall, the Auditor-General. The council met with him and it was good to put some of our problems to him as our problems in western Queensland are very different to the rest of Queensland. Brendan visited Longreach, Barcoo, Diamantina, Boulia and Winton, so he was able to gain valuable insight into the challenges faced by councils in the central west.

Next it was budget time one of the most important times in the council year. This year the rates were increased by 3% in all categories. This included an operational revenue of \$22.5M and an operational expenditure of \$25.5M leaving an operational loss of \$3.2M.

Some of the projects of the coming year include \$1.5M for sealing at Sunshine Flats, \$2.5M to seal 10 kms on the Big Red Road, \$0.5M for town street maintenance, \$3.5M for flood restoration, and \$500,000 for a new bore in Bedourie. Council will continue to be under pressure to be financially sustainable, but when you only control some 6% of the budget, being the portion of rates and charges, it is impossible while still providing services.

The following day, Minister for Tourism Kate Jones and I had the privilege of opening the Big Red Bash. This year it was again the biggest and best ever, with a total of about 12,000 people attending. I continue to be amazed how so many people come so far to the middle of nowhere for 3 days of fun. Everyone without exception tells me what a wonderful time they had. The crowd leaving Birdsville have played havoc with the condition of the roads, but the council have commenced repairing them and they will be in good condition in time for the race crowd who will go about destroying them again. Such is life!

Unfortunately I had to leave on the Thursday for Emerald to attend a meeting organised by the Central Queensland Regional Office of the Department of State Development, Infrastructure and Planning. It included all the councils from the RAPAD and the Fitzroy areas, and is intended to give the Department of Infrastructure some guidelines on priorities. Diamantina did well in that the sealing of the Birdsville-Bedourie road was agreed to be the first priority followed by the sealing of a road from Birdsville to Rockhampton. The Eyre Development road is now the top priority for RAPAD, Outback Road Group and now Dept. of State Development and Infrastructure. It all helps put pressure on State government and Main Roads to fund the sealing of this road.

I was lucky enough to attend the Birdsville Bronco Branding for half a day before having to head off to Longreach for a RAPAD meeting. There was a good little crowd at Birdsville. Congratulations to the committee on the successful weekend.

Regional Express (REX), has announced the trial introduction of Rex Community Fares across its inland routes. This will reduce air fares to Brisbane from our two towns by about \$100 to Brisbane and \$50 to Mt Isa. It is available for seats booked 60 days in advance or any unsold seats in the last 24 hours.

Firstly, congratulations must go to Greg and his team at Big Run Events for another successful Big Red Bash in 2019. Exciting news is that festival dates for 2020 have been announced, with the event returning to a school holiday time slot for all states, from Tuesday 7th to Thursday 9th July, with early entry available on Sunday 5th and Monday 6th July. Thanks to everyone who attended and supported this event and we look forward to welcoming everyone back in 2020.

With the Bash done and dusted, we welcomed the amazing voice and showmanship of Glenn Shorrock, the founding frontman of The Twilights, Axiom and '70s hitmakers Little River Band. Glen filled the Birdsville Community Hall with not just people, but singing and laughter, as part of the Help is on its Way national choral initiative fostering a dialogue around men's positive mental health.

Coming up soon will be the Drovers Run. This event is said to be the most ambitious Drover's Run Outback adventure yet. Leaving Broken Hill on Sunday August 4th with almost 50 vehicles in convoy raising funds for the Westpac Rescue Helicopter Service, the Drovers Run convoy will arrive in Birdsville on the 12th of August before finishing up in Tamworth on the 17th of August.

Next on the event calendar is the Simpson Desert Racing Carnival starting at the Betoota Races on the 30th and 31st of August, followed by the Birdsville Races on the 6th and 7 September and finishing up in Bedourie on the 13th and 14th. Camping, bar and food facilities will be available at all race events.

We can't forget the guys from Simpson Desert Bike Challenge. This unique event in its 33rd year has traditionally started in Purni Bore before finishing in Birdsville. However, this year event organisers have opted to reverse the route starting in Birdsville and finishing at the Mt Dare Hotel. The five-day event consists of 8-stages and will start at the base of Little Red Monday 30th September and finish at the Mt Dare Hotel Saturday 5th October, travelling the QAA and French Lines.



In October we look forward to welcoming back the team from "Shit Box Rally".

Some of you might remember these guys from their last visit in 2015.

This year the spring Shitbox Rally will be held from October 19th to October 25th, travelling from Melbourne to Townsville via Birdsville.

This event is officially endorsed and supported by Cancer Council and will arrive in Birdsville on the 22nd of October bringing with them a whopping 550 people and 270 vehicles.





Even with all this going on, it's business as usually for Council. Residents and businesses should by now have received notice of Council's systematic inspection program for animal management and sewer and water connections.

The purpose of these inspections is to monitor compliance with the Plumbing and Drainage Act 2002, Animal Management (Cats & Dogs) Act 2008 and Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2013. Further details of the inspection program have been included under public notices.

Last, but certainly not least, I would like to congratulate Jock McDonald, Birdsville Town Supervisor, who was recently awarded vocational student of the year for the Central Queensland region. Jock will now progress to the State Finals of the prestigious Queensland Training Awards, which celebrates top achievers in training in Queensland. Across 14 categories, the awards recognise individuals and organisations that strive for and have achieved success, best practice and innovation in vocational education and training (VET).

The bulk sign project will be starting shortly for the crew and they will also be assisting the town crew over the event season.

# Local Schools Community Fund Fact Sheet

The Local Schools Community Fund (the Fund) supports the Australian Government's commitment to education by providing a contribution to schools for small scale projects and their associated costs.

#### What does the Fund offer?

The Australian Government will provide \$30.2 million in 2019–20 to establish the Fund, with up to \$200,000 available for each federal electorate.

The Fund is open to eligible government, Catholic and independent schools.

Schools can apply for one project between \$1,000 and \$20,000. Where a school is composed of multiple campuses, the school or campus may submit an application for each campus to fund a project between \$1,000 and \$20,000.

The funding amount can be for the total cost of the project, or part of the cost where the school contributes an amount.

#### Am I eligible to apply?

To be eligible to apply, a school must be in receipt of Commonwealth recurrent funding for 2019.

#### What projects are eligible?

Projects will be for small scale capital and non-capital initiatives. Projects may include, but are not limited to, one or more of the following components:

- · master-planning
- small scale extensions / refurbishments
- installation of computer or ICT facilities / equipment / software
- · playground and sporting equipment
- shade structures
- landscaping
- procurement of musical facilities, furniture, computer equipment (e.g. digital whiteboards), library resources
- · air-conditioning

- measures to target student wellbeing
- · counselling or youth mental health support
- excursions for students from remote areas
- · additional English as a second language support for refugee students
- specific facilities for students with a disability in a school.

Applications may include more than one project component. For example, a project may comprise of refurbishments and landscaping, or ICT equipment and digital whiteboards.

## How do I apply?

Schools should read the Fund guidelines and notify their approved authority before applying. Schools will also need to provide assurance that the project will be completed by 31 December 2020.

Applications can be submitted online through SchoolsHUB at <a href="https://schools.education.gov.au">https://schools.education.gov.au</a>. Applications open on 25 July 2019 and close at 5:00 pm AEST on 30 September 2019.

## What is the assessment process?

Federal Members of the House of Representatives (MPs) in each electorate will establish a Local Advisory Committee (committee) consisting of at least four members (including the MP), ensuring representation from the government, Catholic and independent school sectors.

The committee will assess applications from schools within their electorate against the assessment criteria and recommend projects for funding to the Minister for Education.

The Minister for Education makes the final decision of which projects will be approved.

## When will I be notified if my application is successful?

The Minister for Education will notify MPs of the outcome of project applications within their electorate by early December 2019. MPs will then have the opportunity to notify schools.

The department will also notify schools in December 2019 of the outcome of their application.

Schools with approved projects can commence once formal notification has been received from the department.
